KS2 - Rocket Reading Rewards!



Our Rocket Reading Rewards will continue this term in KS2!

Over the next week, children will be given a Rocket Reading Target. This target is entirely bespoke to each child's reading ability and usually requires around 15 minutes of reading each day to complete. Each AR book that a child reads is worth a number of points which will then take the child a step



closer to achieving their target after they finish the book and pass their quiz. The more books that are read, the further their rocket moves until... BLAST OFF! The target is met!

Children can see the value of each book from the label on the inside cover. They will also be able to monitor their own progress towards their target by watching their rocket move along when they log into their AR profile. Children who meet their Rocket Target will be invited to participate in a special reward towards the end of the term! So reading rocketeers... get ready for blast off and get reading!!!

After School Clubs

After school clubs will start from Monday 13th January. With the start of a new term we feel now is a good time to set some expectations to ensure that clubs are enjoyable for everyone participating. Unfortunately, last term it was noted that behaviour from some children at our clubs was not what we'd expect in school and we don't want this to spoil the experience for other children attending. We are therefore implementing some club behaviour

stages to keep clubs fun and safe for everyone.

<u>Stage 1</u> – In the event of poor behaviour, the child will receive a verbal warning. Continuation of poor behaviour may require 'time out' and parents informed either face to face or via Dojo message

<u>Stage 2</u> - If there are further incidents of poor behaviour in subsequent club sessions, the child will be asked to sit out the remainder of the session. Parents will contacted by a member of staff to discuss the issue, enlist support and try to find a resolution to ensure good behaviour going forwards.

<u>Stage 3</u> – If on the child's return to club, behaviour has still not improved, parents will receive further contact from a member of staff to explain that the child can no longer attend that after school club. Refunds will be given for any remaining sessions missed as necessary.

We hope that parents can appreciate that these are not actions we ever wish to take and hopefully never will.

However, it is important that clubs remain safe and enjoyable for all children. As ever, thank you for your support.

School Uniform

As we begin this new term, please can we request that children come to school wearing their full school uniform. We're very proud of our uniform and would like to ensure that children look smart each and every day. This means that children should be wearing:

- Black footwear (without other bright colours or designs)
- Green school jumpers, cardigans or fleeces (these should be named)
- No jewellery and only stud earrings (no rings, necklaces etc)
- Long hair should be tied up and back, with green or black hair accessories and no extreme haircuts or colours.
- No nail varnish.
- Sports/PE shirts the Perranporth green sports shirts ensure children look smart on their PE days. On colder days, children should wear their school jumper on top of their sports shirt (not hoodies, or other jumpers) and black shorts or black jogger bottoms/leggings. If your child's shirt has become damaged or needs to be replaced, new shirts can be purchased at Keywear in Truro.

Please also remember to name all items of your child's school uniform - it's much easier to return it whenever it gets lost.

School Attendance Reminder

As parents will know from previous newsletters, good school attendance is extremely important and something we try very hard to work with parents to maintain. We would like to remind parents that we are not able to authorise children's absence for the purpose of holiday during term time. It is important that parents understand that if they remove their child from school and incur unauthorised absences, they may be subject to a penalty notice as explained on our Leave of Absence Request Form. In line with government regulations, Cornwall Council has issued penalty notices to members of our school community already this academic year.

'If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.'

Please ensure the School Office are notified of all planned absences by completing the appropriate Absence Request Form from our the School Office or website: <u>LOA Primary - Exceptional Circumstances Leave Request Form</u>

As our school now has to monitor 'broken weeks' of children's attendance; when children incur two or more broken weeks, staff will contact parents to offer any support available.

Lateness:

We would also like to request that parents and families make every effort to arrive at school on time, between 8:30am and 8:45am. It's always best for children to have a calm and settled start to their day and this really helps set their learning day up properly too. Lateness causes lots of disruptions in classrooms and is also lost learning time too. Parents should also note that arrivals after 9.15am have to be marked in registers as 'unauthorised absence' for the morning session.
